



## Position Announcement News Reporter

Alaska Public Media and KTOO are jointly recruiting for an experienced journalist to join our news teams as a **News Reporter**, responsible for reporting on government and political stories from the state capital for the Alaska Public Radio Network, KSKA-FM, KTOO-FM, 360 North, KAKM-TV and our websites and social media platform.

### The reporter will

- Report and produce government and political stories during Legislative sessions and cover state government and state politics during the interim.
- Pursue enterprise stories that examine state government agencies, budgets and personnel decisions.
- Capture audio, shoot photographs and video, and edit multimedia packages.
- Post news stories and other material on the websites and social media sites.
- Take a leading role in various news, public affairs and election programs for radio, TV and the web.
- Periodically host or anchor news or public affairs programs for radio, TV or the web.
- Collaborate with other news staff on various news and public affairs projects.
- Meet deadlines, abide by AP style, and uphold professional journalistic standards.

### Skills and Qualifications

- Experience working in a news, communication, publication, broadcast or Web environment.
- Ability to work collegially with multiple stakeholders and audiences.
- Ability to work in a team-based organization.
- Application of high journalistic standards and news judgment.
- Bachelor's Degree.
- Skill in on-air radio and/or on-air TV performance and audio production.
- Understanding of reporting (writing, photography, video) for the web.
- Competency in broadcast production and editing (audio, video, photo) software.
- Familiarity with public radio and television news.

The position will be based in Juneau, a small capital city of 30,000 people with the highest per capita education and income levels in state. Located in the heart of the Southeast Alaska panhandle, Juneau is a transportation, retail, medical and service hub with great schools, abundant recreational opportunities and a thriving arts community in a magnificent natural setting. A two hour flight from Seattle, Juneau's climate is similar to the Pacific Northwest. The weather is wet and mild with summer highs in the 60s and 70s and winter lows in the 20s and 30s.
