Southcentral Foundation's Anchorage Vaccine Clinic opens eligibility to K-12 educators, childcare workers, and Alaskans 40 years and older

Anchorage, Alaska – Southcentral Foundation President/CEO April Kyle announced today that SCF will open vaccine appointments to all K-12 educators, childcare workers, and Alaskans who are 40 years old and older as supply allows.

“It is exciting to be part of Alaska’s vaccine success by offering more vaccine to the community while ensuring that all customer-owners and their household members remain eligible for the vaccine.” said Kyle. “The health and wellbeing of our community is a shared responsibility, and we are pleased to make additional vaccine available to even more Alaskans.”

SCF has already offered vaccines to groups including teachers, Alaska State Troopers, Anchorage Police Officers, McLaughlin Youth Center employees, people who are incarcerated and people experiencing homelessness.
